## MAJOR BEHAVIOURAL CONCERNS

### Behaviours that are personally detrimental for the student\*

- The student does not have their equipment.
- They damage their school equipment.
- They do not sit in their seat.
- They complain or argue.
- They cheat.
- They tell lies.
- They use inappropriate language.
- They play with inappropriate objects.
- They do not complete their work.
- They encourage bad behaviours.
- They do not sit properly.
- They do not take on their responsibilities.
- They refuse to work.
- They refuse to cooperate.
- They do not wear the required clothing.
- They are late.
- They are away from school without permission.
- They draw on the desk.
- They drink energy beverages.

### Behaviours that generally disrupt order

- The student gives rude answers to questions from adults.
- They throw dangerous objects.
- They provoke others (make fun of others).
- They tell lies on a regular basis.
- They throw temper tantrums.
- They push others.
- They are abusive towards others.
- They shout at the staff.
- They spit on others.
- They harass others.
- They humiliate others.
- They bully others (gestures, words, attitude).
- They write graffiti.
- They take part in horseplay.
- They shove, push and trip others.
- They prevent others from learning.
- They seem to be taking alcohol or drugs.
- They run away.

### Behaviours that interfere with other people's learning\*

- The student speaks when they should not.
- They give rude answers to questions from adults.
- They damage school equipment.
- They disturb others.
- They throw objects.
- They make inappropriate noises.
- They quarrel.
- They swear in class.
- They provoke others.
- They stand on the furniture.
- They move around without permission.
- They are not in their seat or designated spot.
- They constantly disregard the instructions given.
- They exclude others.
- They leave the classroom without permission.
- They make racist, sexist or other comments.
- They run in the hallway.
- They shout and speak loudly.
- They do not respect the privacy of others in the washrooms.

### Behaviours that are harmful or illegal

- The student uses a cell phone or an iPod at inappropriate times and in inappropriate places.
- They hurt others physically (biting, pushing, kicking, punching, etc.)
- They throw objects that can hurt others.
- They steal or damage other people's property.
- They fight.
- They smoke on school premises.
- They are in possession of drugs or alcohol.
- They are in possession of a weapon.
- They throw a piece of furniture.
- They threaten to hurt someone or to damage something.
- They write threatening graffiti.
- They threaten to kill someone or they assault someone.
- They are dealing drugs.
- They are under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

*\*If these behaviours persist in spite of several interventions, they may become major behavioural concerns.*
